Lucky winners of the penthouse in the first challenge, Queenslanders Trixie and Johnno managed to keep their feet firmly on the ground for the task ahead. That sense of the practical was possibly helped by the fact they are the oldest of the competitors and sensible parents of three. Also, mother Trixie, 37, and electrical fitter, Johnno, 40, have gutted and rebuilt a couple of homes and spruced up another, all on a budget, so they were savvy at making the dollars stretch to achieve a look that said elegant with a hint of the exotic. (Trixie's two-year carpentry apprenticeship helped, too.)

They describe their style as "eclectic and artistic", matching vintage with new, and retro with modern. "My inspiration came from the wooden tiles used in the first bedroom," Trixie says. "I loved their organic look and pattern. The colour was beautiful, as well – I decided to use the blue as a tie-in palette throughout the home and continue using timber and patterned shapes." That's apparent the minute you enter the foyer – the Tapestry wallpaper, with its exotic, Moroccan-inspired motif, is a standout and sets the tone for the apartment.

While the team operated like a well-oiled machine, there was one difference of opinion. "Our only little discussion was when I said I wanted to paint the ceiling the same colour [a pale grey] as the walls," Trixie says. "Johnno wasn't sure if it would work, but we did it and it looks amazing! The judges loved it, too. I will never paint a ceiling white again!"
